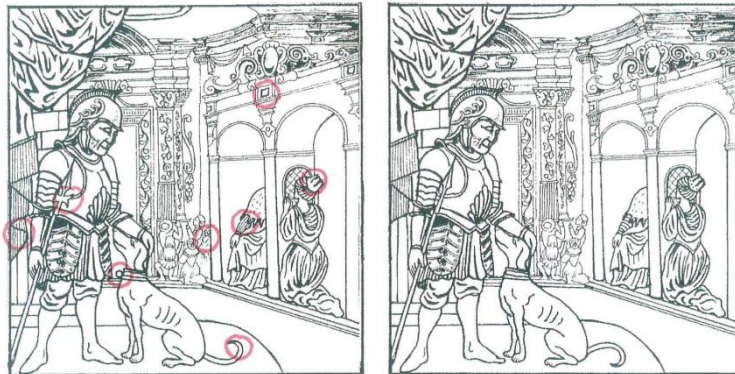

- Agnes joined the convent of Poor Clares in 1234.
- Agnes died in 1282 at the age of 71 years.
- Agnes exchanged letters with St. Clare and popes Gregory IX, Innocence IV and Urban IV.
- Agnes was engaged to Polish duke Boleslav, Henry (son of the Emperor Friedrich II), English king Henry III Plantagenet.
- Agnes' nephew was Přemysl Otakar II.
- It was the order of the Knights of the Cross with the Red Star.

- It was the Judith Bridge from the 12th century.
- The order of the Knights of the Cross with the Red star was founded by St. Agnes.
- St. John of Nepomuk was tortured by Wenceslas IV in the 15th century.
- The main reason was the destruction of the Judith Bridge. The foundation ston was laid down in 1357 on the 9th July at 5:31am.
